## Resolution to Urge Creation of a Clean Energy Task Force

- 2 WHEREAS customers of manufacturers are becoming more interested in assessment of the
- 3 impact on carbon emissions of manufactured products across the entire product life cycle,
- 4 and large retailers are requesting more information from their suppliers about product-
- 5 level environmental impacts, including carbon footprints; and
- 6 WHEREAS Washington's network of hydroelectric power plants is the largest in the nation
- 7 and contributes to combined retail and industrial electricity prices across all sectors that
- 8 are among the lowest in the nation; and
- 9 WHEREAS about 75 percent of the state's electric power comes from energy resources
- including hydropower, solar, and wind generation which generate near-zero carbon
- 11 emissions at the source; and
- 12 WHEREAS Washington State provides a number of incentives for manufacturers, including
- business and occupation tax rate reductions, credits, exemptions, and deductions; sales and
- use tax exemption sand deferrals; property tax exemptions; and low-interest, tax-free
- industrial revenue bonds administered by the Washington Economic Development Finance
- 16 Authority; and

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- 17 WHEREAS The U. S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates
- 18 Washington's manufacturing employment at 289,800 employees, or about 8.6% of total
- employment in November 2015 (see <a href="http://www.bls.gov/eag/eag.wa.htm">http://www.bls.gov/eag/eag.wa.htm</a> );
- 20 WHEREAS Washington State could assist manufacturers in staying competitive by assisting
- 21 them in making their manufacturing processes less carbon-intensive, and by creating an
- 22 attractive business climate for low-carbon manufacturing;
- 23 WHEREAS SB 6545, creating a clean energy task force to explore these issues on behalf of
- 24 the people of Washington State, was reintroduced into the State Senate in 2016;
- 25 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington State Legislature establish a task force
- 26 to make recommendations to the Legislature for modernization or enhancements to the
- 27 state's energy, environmental, regulatory, and tax policies to enhance the health and
- competitiveness of Washington's manufacturing sector following SB 6545.
