Resolution to Support the Passage of I-1329 and Regulate Corporate Money in Politics

1 2	WHEREAS the "useful fiction" of corporate personhood has been used to claim human rights for non-human organizations;
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4 5 6	WHEREAS the Supreme Court has asserted that the fictional corporate human can only "speak' through money and equated regulation of monetary contributions with restrictions on free speech, allowing unlimited and anonymous donations;
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8 9	WHEREAS this has resulted in the corruption of our political system, and the diminishment of citizens' rightful power and true democracy;
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11 12	WHEREAS limits on government power to regulate political contributions necessitates amendment of the federal Constitution;
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14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS in January of 2012 the Washington State Democrats passed resolution WSDCCRES - 559 – 120128 supporting ratification of a constitutional amendment to establish that a corporation shall not be considered a person eligible for rights accorded to human beings under this Constitution, as amended, and the use of money to influence elections or the acts of public officials shall not be considered a protected form of speech.
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20 21 22 23	THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED we urge Washington's Congressional delegation to propose amendments to clarify that constitutional rights, including rights to free speech, apply only to natural persons and not to corporations, and to authorize federal and state governments to limit, and require disclosure of, political contributions and expenditures;
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25 26	THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED we support the passage of Initiative 1329 as the most expedient method of achieving this goal.
