Ratifying and Implementing COP21 1 2 3 WHEREAS an historic agreement to combat climate change was reached by 195 nations, 4 including the United States of America, at the 21st Conference of Parties (COP21) in Paris 5 on December 12, 2015; 6 7 **WHEREAS** the agreement's main aim is to keep a global temperature rise this century well 8 below 2 degrees Celsius and to drive efforts to limit the temperature increase even further 9 to 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels in order to avoid the worst impacts of a 10 changing climate; 11 12 **WHEREAS** the agreement requires actions to: 13 reduce greenhouse gas emissions 14 • support the development of "clean energy" alternatives 15 • be transparent on actions taken and accomplishments 16 • strengthen the ability to protect against and recover from climate change impacts 17 18 **WHEREAS** the agreement will enter into force after 55 countries that account for at least 19 55% of global emissions have deposited their instruments of ratification at the United 20 Nations in New York 21 22 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that we, the Benton County Democrats, call on the U.S. 23 President to ratify the agreement by executive action when it opens for signature on April 24 22, 2016; 25 26 THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we, the Benton County Democrats, call on 27 all levels of U.S. government, federal, state, and local, to work towards meeting the 28 requirements of COP21 and thereby ensure a sustainable energy future; 29 30 THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that we, the Benton County Democrats, call on 31 the Washington State Governor and the Legislature to lead by example in abiding by the spirit and intent of COP21. 32 33 Submitted by Richard Badalamente and the 8th LDDO Climate Change Committee to the 34
